







1. BEFORE DEPARTURE

Check your anchor for condition and securing

Check your spare anchor

Check the anchor rope/chain for condition

Check the anchor windlass for operation, if any

2. BEFORE ANCHORING

Find best available anchorage area

Check the depth

Check the weather and wind forecast for the stay

Check the type of seabed for good anchor hold; sand good

Make sure there is enough space for the boat to swing around the anchor

Check the nautical chart and shore for possible cable and pipeline signs in anchorage area

3. THE ANCHORING

Set bow against the wind

Speed off or use small astern speed to prevent anchor rope going under the boat

Drop the anchor in order

Lower the anchor rope until 3-5 times the depth of the water

Secure the anchoring rope

Observe the hold of the anchor, you may need to start from the beginning

4. AT ANCHOR

Observe your position for anchor hold

Use possible alarming devices (GPS, depth limit)

5. HEAVING UP THE ANCHOR

Bow againt the wind

You can assist the hoist with engine

Prevent anchor rope from going under the boat and to propeller

Secure anchor well
