







1. INSTANT ACTIONS

Shout "FIRE IN THE BOAT!" to alert the crew

Order crew to wear life jackets

Consider emergency anchoring or driving the boat to shore or to shallows

Turn boat so that the smoke and flames go away from the boat and crew

Call for emergency help

Find out what is on fire and if is it possible to put it out yourselves

2. EXTINGUISHING (IF POSSIBLE)

Start extinguishing actions if possible, otherwise abandon the boat

To restrict the fire, close possible fire valve, vents and other openings

If the fire is in the engine room, turn off the engine, close the fuel supply and remove electrical fuses

If the fire is in the galley, shut down gas (if any), DO NOT USE WATER INTO GREASE FIRE

Use extinguisher with short sprays to the roots of the flames

Prepare for abandoning the boat

3. ABANDONING THE BOAT

Close the fuel supply

Start abandoning the boat

Make sure all has life jackets on properly dressed

Prepare the life raft or skiff and set it afloat

Order and control the abandoning, captain leaves last

Activate the emergency rescue transponder (SART/EPIRP) if any

If floating without boat, gather people to one group to keep warm and be more visible

Stay close to boat sink zone to ease the rescue

4. TO KEEP IN MIND IN BOAT FIRES

Most important is to rescue the people not to put out the fire

Do not leave once extinguished fire unguarded, it may ignite again
